Rallying Rules for 2021







WE ARE FINALLY HERE!!!!



Details of what we can and cannot do through the steps of the Governments Road Map to easing lockdown restriction Information taken from GOV.UK and guidance received from Caravan and Motorhome Club

STEP 1 8 March

29 March

STEP 2 STEP 3 No earlier than 12 April No earlier than 17 May

6 people or two households can meet outside. The CAMC have confirmed they consider a single caravan or motorhome classes as house hold, so people can sit together from two units outside.

Rallies can commence but as a campsite

only. No social events

No one can meet inside a caravan or motorhome

Out door social events can now have up to 30 people so we can start to have small activities on the rally field and larger groups socialising outside their Caravan or Motorhome.

6 people or two households can meet outside so you can have friends in your caravan or motorhome but visitors not on the rally are still unlikely to be allowed.

We still will not be able to hold indoor

At least 5 weeks after Step 2



8 MARCH

- Exercise and recreation outdoors with household or
- one other person · Household only indoors

- 29 MARCH · Rule of 6 or two households outdoors
- · Household only indoors

At least 5 weeks after Step 1

SOCIAL CONTACT

- · Rule of 6 or two households outdoors
- · Household only indoors

TO SOCIAL CONTACT

- · Maximum 30 people outdoors
- · Rule of 6 or two households indoors

TRAVEL

- · Domestic overnight stays (household only)
- No international holidays

- · Domestic overnight stays
- · International travel (subject to review)

No earlier than 21 June

There are no longer any restrictions on social gatherings at rallies.

It is likely that there will still be a requirement to have Covid Risk Protocols place on rallies and more details of this w be advised at a later date.

Reminders to ralliers about handwashing and compliance with any Government regulations are to be followed.
